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## **Accountability, Responsibility & Discipline**

### **WEEK 2 of 8**

**For the past few weeks, the Holy Spirit has been revealing to me that in order to change the course of our lives from defeat to victory, we must take control of our tongues.**

It is time for us, as Christians to march forward in a greater demonstration of God's power than ever before. God is calling us to assume our responsibility as mighty warriors who are prepared and equipped to confront the enemy and take the territory that belongs to us as children of the living God.

We must take our position of power and authority and begin to speak forth the Word God puts in our mouths to destroy Satan's strongholds and to speak life and victory into our circumstances.

God has planned and purposed for us, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to speak the Word and see the same powerful results as Jesus. This week we are going to learn four powerful steps how we can live in the same powerful dimension.

At the end of last weeks lesson, I revealed that in our next lesson we were going to learn four powerful steps that will enable us to win the battle over our tongues and live in the same powerful dimension where we are speaking the Word with the same power and authority as Jesus and see the same results. Listed below are those four steps, which the Holy Spirit has asked me to share with you.

#### **STEP #1**

The first step we must take to enter this powerful spiritual dimension is to discipline our tongues and bring them into submission and control of the Holy Spirit.

In Psalms 39:1, David said:

***"I take heed to my ways, that I sin not with my tongue: I will keep my mouth with a bridle, while the wicked is before me."***

To discipline our tongues, we must first recognize the areas of our lives where we have sinned with our tongues.

We must humble ourselves, repent and allow God to sanctify our tongues. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we must then take control of every area until our tongue is fully surrendered to and controlled by the Holy Spirit.

Like the prophet Isaiah, we need to have our mouths purified by a live coal from the altar of God. When Isaiah had a revelation of the holiness of God, he cried out, "**Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts**" (Isaiah 6:5).

When Isaiah saw God he immediately recognized his sinful condition and referred to himself as "*a man of unclean lips.*" Because of the powerful influence that the tongue has over the entire body, Isaiah identified it as being the major instrument of sin.

One of the Seraphim's took a live coal from off the altar and placed it upon Isaiah's mouth.

***"And he laid it upon my mouth, and said, Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away and thy sin purged"*** (Isaiah 6:7).

In sanctifying Isaiah's mouth with the live, burning coal from the altar, God considered him cleansed from his sin, because the tongue is the one member of the Body that is able to contaminate or defile the whole body. It sets the course or direction of our lives. James said that if a man is able to discipline and control his tongue, he is able to control his whole body. He said, "***If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man, and also able to bridle the whole body***" (James 3:2).

The Seraphim did not touch Isaiah's head, hands or any other part of his body...he touched his mouth. Sin is conceived in the heart and mind, but the tongue is the major channel through which sin is expressed.

James compared the tongue to a fire. He said:

***"Likewise the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person, sets the whole course of his life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell"*** (James 3:5-6 NIV).

Satan's strategy is to gain control of our tongues, set them on fire and so influence them throughout our lifetime until our whole life is corrupted and we are speaking cursing and death.

James said the tongue is a "***world of iniquity***" (James 3:6). It defiles the whole body and sets "***on fire the course of nature***" (James 3:6). This refers to the entire life of an individual from birth until death. He said the tongue "***is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison***" (James 3:8). The influence of the tongue is not temporary. If unrestrained or left unsanctified by the Holy Spirit, Satan will control it and use it continuously throughout the entire course of our lives to contaminate our entire being.

Satan's objective is to use our tongues to destroy us. Every time we yield our tongues to criticize, backbite, gossip, lie, slander, or spread discord among our members of the Body of Christ, we are

yielding our tongues to Satan. And as long as we fail to discipline and restrain our tongues from all forms of evil speech, we are giving Satan an opening to defeat us.

When each of us was born again by the Spirit of God, we became a new creation in Christ. **"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold all things are become new"** (2 Corinthians 5:17).

The power of sin was broken and it no longer has dominion over us (See Romans 6:14). Satan cannot use your tongue unless we yield it to him. Paul told the Romans:

***"Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto God. Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteous?"*** (Romans 6:13, 16).

The tongue is one of the smallest members of our bodies, yet it determines the entire course of our lives. Since we have been set free from sin, we must no longer yield our tongues to sin but yield them continually to God as instruments of righteousness. This does not happen automatically, and we cannot control our tongues in our own natural strength. Only through the power of the Holy Spirit that is working in each of us are we able to restrain and bring our tongues into submission to God.

Death and life are in the power of our tongues and it is up to each one of us to discipline ourselves and bring our tongues into submission to the Holy Spirit. It is our responsibility to keep...guard...set a watch...over our mouths that we do not allow our tongues to cause us to sin.

The Apostle Peter said:

***"Whoever would love life and see good days must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from deceitful speech"*** (1 Peter 3:10 NIV).

It is up to each one of us to keep our mouths from speaking evil. We have been given the power through the Holy Spirit, but it is up to each of us to discipline and restrain our tongues. We are accountable to God for how we control our tongues. Jesus said, *"For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned"* (Matthew 12:37).

Before we can speak the Word in power as Jesus did, our tongues must be sanctified, cleansed and purged by the Holy Spirit.

The reason Jesus spoke the Word with such power and authority that blind eyes we opened, the winds and sea obeyed Him, and the dead were raised, was because there was no sin in His mouth. His tongue was controlled by the Holy Spirit. He was guiltless.

Peter wrote:

**"...Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps: Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth: Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously" (1 Peter 2:21-23).**

I looked up the word guileless in the Greek. It means "pure, unadulterated, without evil." According to 1 Peter 2:21-23, there was absolutely no trace of evil in the words coming out of Jesus' mouth. There was no deceit. There was nothing false or misleading. When Christ was insulted, slandered and falsely accused, He did not lift His voice in retaliation. He did not lash out in anger at those who beat or mocked Him. He restrained His tongue and committed Himself to the Father.

When Jesus spoke, He did not utter vain, useless words. He spoke with a purpose. He spoke the words the Father had instructed Him to speak. He said, "***I do nothing of myself; but as my Father hath taught me, I speak those things***" (John 8:28). "***I speak to the world these things which I have heard of him***" (John 8:26). "***...The words which ye hear is not mine but the Father's which sent me***" (John 14:24).

The words coming from His mouth were eternal, infallible and incapable of error because they proceeded out from the Father. God said, "***So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it***" (Isaiah 55:11).

Jesus spoke forth LIFE. He said, "***Heaven and earth shall pass away: but my words shall not pass away***" (Mark 13:31). He spoke forth LIFE. He said, "***...the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life***" (John 6:63). The words in His mouth were not limited by natural laws...they were life-giving Spirit filled words because they came from the throne of Almighty God.

For us to speak the Word with power and authority as Jesus did, we must cry out to God and ask Him to send the fire of the Holy Spirit to sanctify our tongues. When Isaiah had a revelation of the holiness of God, he recognized his need and cried out, "***Woe is me. For I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips***" (Isaiah 6:5). Today, the Church of Jesus Christ must recognize its need, cry out to God and allow Him to purge our tongues.

We cannot speak the forth the Word with power and authority as Jesus did when we are continuing to speak forth evil or negative words of fear, doubt and unbelief. Our mouths and tongues cannot be filled with the powerful life-giving words inspired by the Holy Spirit if our tongues are undisciplined and uncontrolled. We must continually yield our tongues to the Holy Spirit and speak the words God gives us to speak.

## **STEP #2**

The second step we must take to live in this powerful new dimension where we are speaking the Word in the same power and authority as Jesus, with the same results: **We must go beyond the surface in order to determine the root cause where the battle must be fought and won so we gain control over our tongues.**

Jesus revealed the root cause as He told the Pharisees:

***"O generation of vipers, how can ye, being evil, speak good things? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh. A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things. But I say unto you, that every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned"*** (Matthew 12:34-3).

What is in our hearts and minds determines our actions and the words coming out of our mouths. If our hearts and minds are filled with negative thoughts...hatred, anger, jealousy, fear, worry, pride, bitterness, strife...that is exactly what will come out of our mouths. If our hearts and minds are filled continually with evil thoughts...lusts of the flesh, carnal desires and wicked imaginations...it will be manifested in the words coming out of our mouths.

On the other hand, if our hearts and minds are filled with positive thoughts...faith, love, joy, peace...that is what will be coming out of our mouths. If our hearts and minds are filled with God's word, our hearts are centered on God and fulfilling His will, the word of God, faith-filled words and praise will be coming out of our mouths.

What is in our hearts and minds determines what we are, *"For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he"* (Proverbs 23:7).

Jesus said:

***"For from within, out of the heart of men proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness: All these evil things come from within, and defile the man"*** (Mark 7:21-23).

The Pharisees had an outward appearance of being holy. They had a form of religion. They were faithful in paying their tithes and observing all the Law. Yet, Jesus called them a *"generation of vipers."* He compared them to poisonous snakes. Why? The words coming out of their mouths revealed the evil that was within them.

Jesus had just cast out a devil and healed a man who had been blind and dumb. Instead of praising God, the Pharisees blasphemed and slandered Jesus. They said, *"This fellow doth not cast out devils, but by Beelzebub the prince of devils"* (Matthew 12:24). The evil words coming out of their mouths came from evil hearts and minds. He said, *"O generation of vipers, how can ye, being evil, speak good things?"* (Matthew 12:24).

He told them:

***"Either make the tree good, and his fruit good: or else make the tree corrupt, and his fruit corrupt: for the tree is known by his fruit"*** (Matthew 12:33).

Just as a tree is judged good or bad according to the fruit it bears, so are we able to determine what is the true character of a man or woman by the words he/she speaks. A good tree that is strong and healthy cannot produce corrupt fruit. Neither can a tree that is diseased and rotting away produce

good fruit. And, even though someone claims to be a Christian and has an outward appearance of righteousness, if that person's heart and mind are not pure, the words coming out of his/her mouth, will not be pure. A heart and mind that are corrupted by jealousy, anger, pride or bitterness cannot produce the fruit of good, wholesome words. The heart and the mind must first be cleansed and renewed by the Holy Spirit.

### STEP #3

The third step we must take to enter this powerful dimension of speaking the Word with the same power and authority as Jesus: **You must take hold of the 100% victorious mind God has made possible for us to have.**

God has given us the power of a sound mind. Paul told Timothy, "*For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline*" (2 Timothy 1:7 NIV).

Sometime ago God showed me that Satan is launching a massive counterattack against the Church. The Spirit revealed to me that there are seven major strategies Satan is using to come against the entire Body of Christ to short-circuit and stop the advance that the Church of Jesus Christ is making into his territory. At that particular time the Spirit revealed to me how Satan's major point of attack is on our hearts and in our minds. The Spirit then revealed to me how we can have a 100% victorious mind.

This is where we must start, by taking hold of that 100% victorious mind where we are resisting Satan and bringing every thought into captivity unto the obedience of Christ (2 Corinthians 10). Once our hearts and minds are 100% free, 100% clean, 100% healthy, 100% renewed...

- Then we will have pure lips and pure lives;
- Then we will be able to speak the Word in the same power and authority as Jesus and see the mountains moved out of our way;
- Then we will be able to rebuke Satan and he will flee;
- Then we will be able to speak the Word into our circumstances and see the supernatural power of God released;
- Then we will be able to speak the Word and see blind eyes opened, deaf ears unstopped, the lame walk and all manner of disease and sickness healed!

There are no shortcuts. The victory over our tongue must start in our hearts and our minds. If we want to live in this new powerful dimension, we must take hold of the powerful victorious mind of Christ.

There are so many Christians today who are allowing Satan to have "his way" in their minds without putting up any resistance or spiritual effort to take their thoughts into captivity. Not only are they allowing every negative thought, every doubt, every fearful thought, and every temptation to enter their minds, they are allowing them to remain and are dwelling upon them.

As a result, they are speaking negative words of fear, doubt, failure and defeat.

Jesus said, "*Out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaketh*" (Matthew 12:34).

Paul told Timothy:

"...God hath not given us the spirit of fear: but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind" (1 Timothy 1:7).

I looked up the Greek word for sound. It is "*spohronismos*," which is a calling to a soundness of the mind or to self-control. It literally means discipline. God has planned for us to have a "sound" mind...one that is well-disciplined, 100% free, 100% healthy, 100% renewed, 100% victorious.

The Holy Spirit has revealed to me that in order for us to have a 100% victorious mind, we must rise up in the power and anointing of the Holy Spirit and discipline our minds by resisting Satan, taking control of our thoughts, wills, emotions, desires and attitudes, and bringing them under the control of the Holy Spirit and in conformity to the will of God.

If we fail to do this, and have a passive mind, where we fail to resist Satan's attacks and allow our minds to be filled with every negative thought...every carnal, fleshly desire...every fear, doubt, worry...out of the abundance of the heart and mind will come carnal, negative, evil words. As a result, we will be speaking forth cursing and death instead of life and blessing.

In order for us to speak the Word with power, the Word must become flesh again within us.

Jesus said, "A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things" (Matthew 12:35). What is the good treasure Jesus was referring to?

The good treasure stored up in a believer's heart and mind is the all-powerful, living and written *word of God*. The word of God is eternal...from everlasting to everlasting. Jesus said, "...the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit and they are life" (John 6:63).

The Holy Spirit has shown me that only when the word of God becomes flesh again within us...within our hearts and minds...will we be able to speak forth the word with the same power and authority as Jesus.

Jesus and the word are one. They cannot be separated. The Bible says in John 1:1-4, 14 that:

*"In the beginning was the word, and the word was with God, and the word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life; and the life was the light of men. And the word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."*

When our hearts and minds are saturated with the Word...the living and written Word is continually abiding within us renewing our hearts and minds, ruling us and we will be speaking forth pure, powerful, faith-filled words that are spirit and life!

I am not talking about "head knowledge" of God's word. I am talking about an experience where the Word has become part of you where it is living and ruling in your heart and mind.

There is just no way that you can speak forth life if the Word is not in you. Jesus said:

*"Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. If ye abide in me and my words abide in you, you shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you" (John 15:4, 7).*

When the written and living Word is in us and we are continually living in Him, THEN we will be able to have whatsoever we ask...speaking it forth in the name of Jesus.

On the other hand, Jesus said, *"...an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things"* (Matthew 12:35). The evil treasures of a man's heart are the evil lusts, carnal desires, greed, jealousy, pride and bitterness that are stored within him. As long as this evil treasure remains within him, he will bring forth evil things.

You are the one who determines what will come out of your mouth, whether you will bring forth good out of the "*good treasure*" of your heart, or whether you will bring forth evil treasure out of the "*evil treasure*" of your heart.

Since what is in your heart and mind determines the words coming out of your mouth, which determines the entire course of your life, you must program your mind for victory. God has not planned for you to be defeated. He has planned for you to have the powerful 100% victorious mind of Christ operating in your life. In 1 Corinthians 2:16, Paul told us:

*"For who has known or understood the mind (the counsels and purposes) of the Lord so as to guide and instruct (Him) and give Him knowledge? But we have the mind of Christ, the Messiah, and do hold the thoughts (feelings and purposes) of His heart" (1 Corinthians 2:16 TAB).*

God has placed His Spirit within us, so that we might have the "*mind of Christ*." It is His Spirit Who reveals to us His thoughts, His purposes, His desires, and His will.

He has revealed the "*mind of Christ*" to us through His word. As we fill our hearts and minds with His word, and bring our minds into submission to His thoughts, His will, His purposes, His desires, we are transformed into His image, we have His mind, we are able to speak forth the Word He has put in our mouths in the same power and authority and see the same results.

In order for us to take hold of the 100% victorious mind of Christ, the Holy Spirit has revealed to me that a change must take place in our minds. In the book of Romans, Paul told us: "*And do not be conformed to world, but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect*" (Romans 12:2, NAS).

The renewing or "*making new*" of the mind Paul was referring to in this verse is the adjustment of our thoughts, will, emotions and desires to the mind of God which requires a conscious effort on our part as believers. It requires discipline!

To program our minds for victory and have the victorious mind of Christ operating within our lives, our minds must continually be renewed. We must put off the old man, with its carnal nature and

carnal mind, and put on the new man with its new nature and renewed mind. This is something each one of us must do!

It is up to you to discipline your mind, where you are constantly refusing and putting off the carnal mind...with its carnal, fleshly desires...and are constantly putting on the new nature...with its new mind, attitudes, desires, will.

Don't say you can't do it! You can! Don't listen to the Devils' lies. Do not allow yourself to have a passive mind. Rise up in the new strength God is pouring into your innermost being...into your heart and mind...and take possession of the 100% victorious mind God has made possible for you.

**God is bringing you to a point of accountability, where you are disciplining your mind and tongue, bringing them into submission to the Holy Spirit and the Word of God.**

#### **STEP #4**

The forth step we must take to live in a powerful dimension where we are speaking God's Word in the same power and authority as Jesus is to speak forth blessing instead of cursing.

In the Book of Proverbs, the Bible says:

*"Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and they who indulge it shall eat the fruit of it (for life or death)"* Proverbs 18:21, TAB.

Our words determine the entire course of our lives! We are either speaking forth...

- Blessing or Cursing...
- Power or Weakness...
- Faith or Unbelief...
- Victory or Defeat...
- Abundance or Lack...
- Life or Death!

As Christians, if we continually speak negative words of fear, doubt and discouragement, we are setting the course of our lives to live in discouragement and defeat. If we constantly talk about our problems...our sickness...lack of finances...we will continue to live with our problems, sicknesses and lack of finances.

However, if we take control over our tongues, get rid of the doubt and unbelief in our hearts and minds, begin to fill our mouths with faith-filled words and the powerful Word of God and begin to speak if forth, we'll be setting the course of our lives to live in victory.

Just for a moment, stop and think about the circumstances you are facing right now. What are the deep needs in your life...in your family...at home...on the job...in your ministry? What are the words coming from your mouth regarding these circumstances? Are you speaking cursing or blessing...faith or doubt...victory or defeat?

The Apostle James compared our tongues to bits in horses' mouths and the rudder of a ship. In James 3:3-5, NIV, he said:

*“When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark”.*

In verse three, the word “bits” is the noun from the verb *bridle*. It refers to the reins or the whole bridle, as well as the actual bit. With the bit we can gain control of the horse’s mouth, obtain its obedience, and be able to turn the horse in any direction we choose. By placing pressure on the bit in the horse’s mouth, the rider can change the direction of the horse.

The same is true with the rudder on a ship. The rudder is very small in comparison to the large ship that weighs thousands of pounds. Yet, when pressure is applied to it, it controls the direction of the ship and keeps it on course regardless of the fierce winds and pounding waves.

Although our tongue is one of the smallest members of our body, it determines the course of our lives and if we can control our tongue, we can control our entire body. According to the reports of leading neurosurgeons, the speech center in our brain has total dominion over all the other nerves in our bodies.

For example, if a person keeps saying, “I’m too weak to do that”; “I don’t have the ability to do this job”; “I’m afraid”, right away our nerves receive the message from our central nervous system saying they are weak or incapable, or fearful, and our body begins to adjust itself to what it has heard.

One of the major reasons why the Church is in a weakened condition and the power of the Lord is not being released through us Christians in the same powerful dimension as Jesus is because most Christians are speaking cursing instead of blessing. On the one hand, we are blessing and praising the Lord with our tongues, but at the same time, we are speaking fear, doubt, lack, and failure. Instead of edifying and encouraging others, we have been speaking cursing, gossip, slander, backbiting, murmuring and complaining. As a result, we have brought cursing upon ourselves.

In James 3:9-12, the Apostle wrote the following concerning our tongues speaking forth blessing and cursing:

*“With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse men who were made in God’s likeness! Out of the same mouth come forth blessing and cursing. These things, my brethren, ought not to be so. Does a fountain send forth (simultaneously) from the same opening fresh water and bitter? Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine figs? Neither can a salt spring furnish fresh water”.*

In these verses, James was writing to the Church, not to ungodly sinners. He was pointing out a serious problem that was prevalent in the Church. Christians were using their tongues to praise and worship God, to speak His word, to pray for the sick and those in need, and at the same time to speak forth cursing to one another.

It is a great contradiction and against God's will for man to use the same tongue he uses to bless and glorify God to speak evil, slander, backbite or tear down others. It is just as contrary to the laws for a fig tree to produce olives, or a grapevine to produce figs, or a spring to produce fresh and salty water simultaneously.

James said; *"These things, my brethren, ought not to be so"* (James 3:10). Blessing and cursing should not come out of our mouths. Any time we use our tongues against someone else, it is considered as a form of evil speaking and brings cursing upon us.

James told us:

*"(My) brethren, do not speak evil about or accuse one another. He that maligns a brother or judges his brother is maligning and criticizing the Law and judging the Law. But if you judge the Law, you are not a practicer of the Law, but a censor and judge (of it). One only is the Lawgiver and Judge—the One) Who has the absolute power of life and death—Who is able to save and destroy. (But you), who are you that (you presume to) pass judgment on your neighbor? So any person who knows what is right to do, but does not do it, to him it is sin"* (James 4:11-12, 17 TAB).

Malign: 1. to speak harmful untruths about; speak evil of; slander ; defame: to malign an honorable man. adjective 2. evil in effect; pernicious ...

In Titus 3:2, Paul told us: *"...speak evil of no man"*. He also told us in Ephesians 4:29: *"Let no foul or polluting language, nor evil word, nor unwholesome or worthless talk (ever) come out of your mouth"*.

As I have been saying, Satan has entered into the Church and has gained a major stronghold where he is bringing confusion, strife and division through Christians who have failed to discipline their tongues. They are speaking forth blessing and cursing; blessing God and speaking evil of others.

We must have a breakthrough! We cannot continue to use our tongues to speak forth blessing and cursing. Because we have yielded our tongues to Satan and have allowed our tongues to speak evil of others, we have brought cursing instead of blessing.

In WEEK 3 we will go out onto the battlefield of our tongues to learn **Step #5—Set a watch over your tongue!** We will look at the different forms of evil speaking that are weakening the position of the Church and hindering us from manifesting the fullness of God's power.
